Principal and Vice Principal's Report: Renee Pick and Sandra Jost

- Miss Pick reported out on her visits to a variety of Traditional Schools in Calgary, and one in Scottsdale, AZ.
- Mrs. Jost visited traditional schools in the Lower Mainland
- Calgary there are 16 Traditional Learning Centres (TLCs)
 - Students and staff wear uniform and all schools have the same logo wear.
 - They have moved to a Learning Commons model whereby this library or resource room area is open all day to all students. It is a lively area and has been created to encourage student directed learning.
 - Students are drilled to the point of mastery of skills once these foundations are mastered students can apply them to inquire and explore topics of interest.
- Abbotsford
 - Struggling with enrollment so traditional schools are changing from non-catchment to catchment designation
 - o Many traditional standards are being lost including uniforms, assemblies...
- Surrey using FreshGrade for all reporting
- The information gleaned from these visits will be used to honour:
 - Academics celebrating success in all areas and developing awards program critieria, certificates, announcements
 - Traditional Culture virtue-based program whereby exemplary students are honoured, e.g. cleanest classroom, uniform recognition, etc.
- Miss Pick has a lot more information on the schools that she and Mrs. Jost visited and is happy share it. In addition, CTS will be hosting two schools from Surrey this week who want to continue the conversation about Traditional schools.

School Renovation Projects: Starr Munro

- New Front Entrance
- Parent Drop Off Area at Front
- Medical Room moved to old Copy Room in main office. Copy room moved to old medical room.
- Working on "beautification" plan for front of school and grounds improvement.
- Wanting to create a sense of "welcome" and community at front of, and on school property.

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entry and playground areas of the school:

- 8 person picnic tables x 3. Create area for parents to gather, but also to be used as an outdoor learning/teaching space. (picnic tables run around \$1600 a piece)
- 2 Buddy Benches elsewhere on school ground (\$530 a piece)

Farmer Construction has agreed to donate the costs to install the picnic tables. Also going to ask them to make a donation for a picnic table. Other possible sources of donations for tables and benches include...Cloverdale Child Care Centre, Thrifty Foods, Quadra Cedar Hill Community Association, some other local businesses.

In order to get the tables installed before we head back to school, we will need to purchase them by the end of May. We are planning to chase down donations for tables and benches until we have the majority of them paid for, but in the meantime the PAC may have to front some of the costs for this.

Motion: To put aside and pay up to \$6,000 from the reserve fund, to cover the costs for 3 picnic tables and 2 Buddy Benches, for installation as part of the new CTS Front Entrance Plaza Project, with the expectation that the majority of costs for these items will be covered by donations solicited from the community by the PAC. – Karen Grigolato
