## Exciting Back To Cloverdale News!

At the AGM on Tuesday the PAC Executive was able to share exciting news that besides getting a new front entrance, new parent drop off area, and new water fountains upon our return to the Cloverdale site...that the medical room will be moved into the main office area (where the Copy Room used to be). Also, a number of other community businesses/organizations have expressed interest in making donations towards enhancing the new front entrance plaza area and school grounds. In hopes of creating a more welcoming, community gathering place and outdoor learning space, the PAC Executive proposed the installation of 3 to 4,8 person picnic tables and 2 Buddy Benches.
