Happy 100 years Cloverdale School Community! Today we welcomed special guest School District 61 Board Vice-Chair Tom Ferris, School Board Trustee Deborah Nohr, Associate Superintendent Deb Whitten, MLA Rob Fleming, and Mayor of Saanich, Richard Atwell to our school to help us celebrate. We also welcomed students, parents, and staff, and alumni students, parents and staff.

We began our assembly with a connection to our musical roots by showing a photograph of a 1940's orchestra of Cloverdale School. When this photo was discovered we knew that a feature of our assembly needed to include our Grade 5 Strings group. We have currently had an orchestra for ten years. It is was with pride that we welcomed our 52 Grade 5 students, the class of 2017 and their conductor Mrs. Margaret Dzybik playing 2 songs for us; 'Cabbage Countdown' by Bob Phillips, and 'At the Grasshopper Ball' by Richard Meyer. We were treated to a polished performance after just 8 months of learning their strings instruments.

Our students performed a song called 'The Cloverdale Anniversary Song' by former teacher Mr. Michael Davies. Our choir led our students in singing another song called 'We're From Cloverdale".

We had a chance to glimpse through 100 years of history. Our gymnasium was transformed thanks to hours of research and 'just right' teaching to bring the study of our school's history within a decade by decade back drop to our student audience aged 11 and under. Our final slideshow photo today showed the 50<sup>th</sup> Birthday cake cutting. This birthday was celebrated in 1967 with special guests at the time. We even re-enact this photo by welcoming to the front our special guests from the school district and municipal and provincial government as well as Vice Principal Sandra Jost and former Principal Terry Kotyshyn.
