DISTRICY AND COMMUNITY UPDATES:

60 Second Science Challenge

This cool kid-friendly experiment creates an awesome effect and teaches kids the effects of density.

What you need: Cooking oil, Water, Food coloring, Alka-seltzer® antacid tablets, Water Bottle

What you do: Step 1: Fill your empty water bottle 1/3 full with water, Step 2: Add a few drops of food coloring, and swirl to mix, Step 3: Fill the rest of the bottle with cooking oil. Drop one piece into your bottle and watch your lava lamp fizz, bubble and swirl! **The Science Behind it:** The Alka Seltzer® tablet contains chemicals which react in water, creating carbon dioxide gas in the process. The gas pulls up some water with it as it moves through the oil. Together, the gas and water are less dense than the oil. The water sinks back down to the bottom once the gas escapes because water is denser than oil.
