# CTS Emergency Food and Water Supplies

As part of our ongoing school wide emergency preparedness, individual rations of emergency food and water arrived this week to replace our current supply. We purchased food and water for 325 persons in 2012. This high quality food and water had a shelf life of five years. It was made and packaged in Delta, BC by FAST Inc. This company ships food and water to disasters all over the world. The food and water expired last month. We were able to repurchase food and water thanks to the \$15 donations by new kindergarten and new grade 1-5 parents every fall for the past five years. Thanks to Starr Munro and a wonderful group of parents, we moved the new food and water into our emergency supplies area, which is the kiln room (a dry, heated storage room under the ramp at the back of the school just outside the gym doors). We have asked FAST about how to dispose of the expired food and water. They have written back that the food and water has a longer than a 5 year shelf life, but that they can't legally stamp it past five

years. We are offering our current parents the expired food and water (free of charge) for your home emergency supply kits and will be distributing it at the January and February PAC nights. The water packs could be frozen and used as emergency ice packs, and/or stored for longer periods of time as individual washing/cooking water. The food supplies might last a couple of years more, pending they are stored carefully and kept dry. Always be sure to double check the safety and quality of all emergency preparedness supplies before using What are the ingredients in the F.A.S.T. emergency food rations?

The F.A.S.T. emergency food rations are made at a plant in Delta, BC using a combination of wheat flour, sugar, canola shortening, coconut and flavouring. There are no preservatives added. The food rations are 100% vegan and trans-fat free.

### Active and Safe Routes to School

For the past year our school has been participating in an Active and Safe Routes to School program promoting and encouraging active modes of transportation to and from school. From cycling or walking, to busing or driving to a five-minute walk away there is a solution that suits every family. By choosing active transportation together we can make our school zone a safer place for everyone by reducing the traffic congestion in the immediate area. As part of our Active and Safe Routes to School program a 'Best Routes to School' map has been created.
