What Happens When There's a COVID Exposure at CTS?

As many of you know, there has been a significant increase in positive COVID-19 cases amongst elementary school aged children since the start of school in September. We've heard from many concerned parents that they would appreciate more information regarding school exposures. It's been our experience that if there is a positive COVID-19 exposure *in your child's classroom*, you should receive an email notifying you of the dates of this exposure from Island Health.

Furthermore, there are very specific contact tracing investigations that take place, in which Island Health determines who should be self-isolating, who should self-monitor, and the appropriate next steps. We found it reassuring to hear from our admin team that a seating chart is kept on file at the office for each classroom to assist public health with contact tracing.

Please note that Island Health is no longer sending a notification for school exposures to the whole school. It is our understanding that they contact families by phone who have a child that will need to isolate and they email only the affected classroom.
